Welcome to the 2024 music program. Once again, we have a range of private instrumental music lessons available for students. Music lessons are limited to one instrument per student. If your child would like to learn a second instrument we can timetable it for before or after school lessons, recess or lunch time. Payment for lessons is to be made direct to the music teacher as well as enquiries regarding your child's progress.

Continuing students will commence lessons in Week 1 with a temporary timetable. New students will commence Week 3, Monday 12th February. You will be contacted by Christine Cavaiuolo or your instrumental music teacher as soon as timetables have been finalised.

If you would like to **hire an instrument** please tick the appropriate box on the return slip below as the school is able to provide instruments at a discounted hire rate from Size Music.

Students learning instruments, here and through outside tuition, are strongly encouraged to join the Concert Band or String Orchestra. The String Orchestra, conducted by Sian Williams, is suitable for all abilities on violin/viola/cello (the music is arranged so that beginners can also join after a few terms of lessons). Students who play a brass or wind instrument are welcome to join the Concert Band, conducted by Mark Hudson. These are great opportunities for your child to enhance their skills/repertoire, play as a group and perform regularly.
